I went along to the Community BBQ at Nightingale Reserve in the hopes of meeting some locals and build connections. I made friends with a lovely family who lived only 100m away. Our kids are the same age and became instant best buddies. They both started at Magill Kindergarten 6 months later and the fact that they knew each other made a huge impact on the transition. Now we walk home together every Kindy day.

Holding the play street close after was a great idea to continue on the momentum. Being tied with the Magill Kindergarten, it meant we were able to meet the teachers and some of the kids who would be attending. We made another great connection there and the two friends became three (Charlie, Everly and Izzy). The connection between us parents has also grown into a beautiful, supportive friendship with regular playdates between us.

I feel the concentrated energy from the council has helped transform the atmosphere in the areas. Unfortunately through COVID we learnt that people/strangers equals dangers and if we saw someone walking towards us we would be more likely to cross the road then to stop and chat. But that has changed now and people always say hello as we pass and stop to talk. Getting to know some of the long-time residents at these gatherings has also been a great way to form connections and learn about the people around us and the history of the area.

Jenny's family hosted a street BBQ in December 2022.






Vicki, Magill Kindy said
