



Council's Role

Identify a working model for our region

Ensure risks can be managed

Option 1:

- Run community EOI
- Seed fund for five years
- Support transition to community-led, financially self-sufficient not-for-profit

Option 2:

- Publish work done to date
- Hand over to community and industry to deliver if they wish
